good to see there are still journalists around in the 23rd century (after all, the lawyers are all dead, aren't they?).


SS Robert Fox-I love LOVE continuity like this.

Gene Roddenberry's Andromeda was quickly approaching a serious crossroads. A major change was just around the bend, unbeknown to the fans or writing staff and producers (with the exception of Kevin Sorbo. More on that in months to come.). This change was so monumental that the show, which was on the verge of greatness, would have to settle for just being good. It could have been glorious.

I get the feeling that pretty much every

episode of the first season had or would have a sequel. This is not a bad thing, since foreshadowing is a great tool of a great writer. I just wish more writers would use it, but most are just too lazy.

Dylan is having a party. Actually, it's a gathering for all members of the new Commonwealth to sign an arms treaty. Attending this little affair is a Perseid named Hohne (we will see him again), an intergalactic reporter named Satrina (who crashes the party) and a Nietzchean named Charlemagne Bolivar (who also crashes the party and is played by James Marsters of Buffy fame).

Both Hohne and Satrina want the All -Systems Library (from the first-season episode "Harper 2.0"). Hohne, a colleague of the Perseid who originally gave it to Harper, wants to study it. Satrina, who's really an associate of Jeger, the bounty hunter who originally tried to take it from Harper and is working for the Spirit of the Abyss, the Magog god (also from "Harper 2.0").

They both possess the ability to tesseract, the bending of time and space, enabling them to move through matter. This also gives Satrina the ability to remove the Magog larvae from Harper's stomach.

This very good episode finds Trance very concerned about what Harper remembers from the Library about her (He does remember something!), so much that she actually threatens him if he does.

Charlemagne convinces Dylan that he could be an asset to the Commonwealth. He also informs Dylan of Elsbeth's pregnancy and assures him it is not

that Dylan slept with her.). Charlemagne tries to convince Tyr of that as well, promising him one of his sisters for his cooperation.

Satrina removes some of the larvae and makes off with the disc of the Library, but Harper has installed a virus that immediately sends the information back to him and infests her computer. She has assassing who have tesseract generators and come in a rainbow of flavors to kill everyone at the party.

This episode was really good as a stand-alone, and brilliant when taken in context with future episodes. Oh, by the way, in Harper's lab is a giant bomb he's been working on all season long. It comes very much in handy in the future.
